

→ Stay home if you have ANY symptoms.

If you test positive for Covid:

- Isolate at home for at least 5 days *after* the first day of symptoms or the day of testing positive (whichever came first).
- Isolation can last up to 10 days, if symptoms persist.
- You can come out of isolation after day 5 if your symptoms are improved and you haven't had a fever within 24 hours.
- You do not need to test negative before returning to school. (However, if you do test yourself and you test positive, stay home for up to 10 days total).
- Wear a mask indoors at school through the 10 days after Covid began, even if you have no symptoms.
- Inform your child's pediatrician that your child has tested positive.
- Athlete's will need medical clearance before returning to play on a team sport.

If you live with someone who tests positive:

- Wear a mask indoors at school through your family member's isolation period and for 5 days after that, regardless of your vaccination status.
- Test yourself every 1 to 2 days for that period of time.
- If you develop any symptoms or test positive, stay home.
- Contact the school nurse to obtain tests.

If you are a close contact of someone who tests positive:

- If it is a close contact at school, you will be notified by school and will be provided with a package of 2 test kits and instructions.
- Students and staff members who are close contacts can attend school if they have no symptoms.
- Stay home if you have any symptoms and test.
- *If you are not up to date on your Covid vaccines, test on day 4 and day 5 after being exposed or notified.
- Notify the school nurse if you have symptoms or test positive.
- The school nurse can give you additional tests if needed.

* Up to date on Covid vaccines means that you had your booster shot OR completed your Pfizer or Moderna vaccine series within the last 5 months OR completed your Johnson & Johnson vaccine within the last 2 months.
